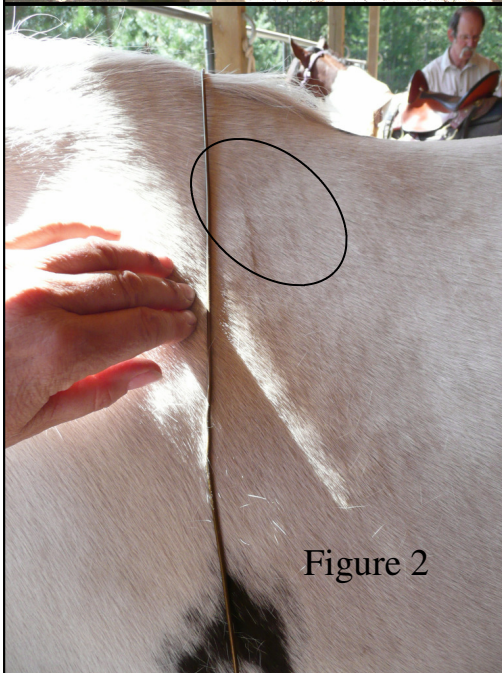
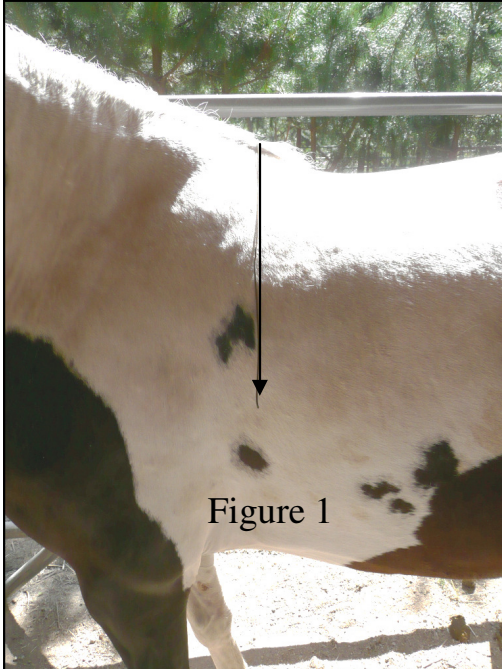


Measure for Gullet Width



1. Cut a wire coat hanger or use some other stuff wire.
2. Put it over the withers of your horse as shown.
3. Bend it so that it touches your horse all the way down and evenly over the wither.
4. The top of the wither usually is directly above the back of the knee and straight up from the front of the riders groove.
5. It is usually just behind the scapula or shoulder blade also, as shown in figure 2 by the tips of my fingers.
6. Lay the shaped wire on a piece of paper and draw around it.
7. Measure down 3 inches and draw a line straight across from side to side as in figure 3. The length of this line tells you how wide the gullet of your saddle should be.
8. Remember, your horse may fatten up or slim down, fill out, or atrophy. It will change the width of your horses withers, and needed gullet size.
9. The ovals in figures 2 and 3 represent the wither pocket where the front and rounded part of a tree bar should sit.
